Abstracts are invited in all areas and aspects of Neo-Latin Texts, including, but not limited to: Neo-Latin Drama, Neo-Latin Epic (or other poetic genres), Neo-Latin Fiction, Neo-Latin Historiography and Ethnography, Neo-Latin Imitation, Neo-Latin Language and Style, Neo-Latin Letter Collections, Journals, Biographies, Autobiographies, Neo-Latin Rhetoric, Neo-Latin Treatises on Architecture, Botany, Cartography, Geography, Mathematics, Medicine, Music, Philosophy, Theology, Science, etc.

Papers in the Neo-Latin Studies Track will be given on **21 April 2022 only**. Papers will be given **online only**. There will be no in-person papers. Paper presentations are 20 minutes followed by a 10-minute question & answer session. Papers need to be read in English. Abstracts should be no more than 250 words.

Acceptance of a paper implies a commitment on the part of all participants to register for the conference and present a paper online. **All presenters must pay the appropriate registration fee by Friday, March 4th 2022 to be included in the program.** *Failure to pay by this deadline will result in the immediate removal of your abstract from the conference program. We will attempt to contact you before removing your presentation.*

The KFLC has a tradition of attracting scholars from a broad range of languages and specializations. This year's conference will have sessions in Arabic and Islamic Studies, East Asian Studies, French and Francophone Studies, German-Austrian-Swiss Studies, Hispanic Linguistics, Hispanic Studies (Spanish Peninsular and Spanish American), Indigenous and Endangered Languages, Intercultural Studies, Italian Studies, Hebrew and Jewish Studies, Language Studies for the Professions, Linguistics, Lusophone Studies, Music Studies in Language and/or Cultures, Neo-Latin Studies, Russian and Slavic Studies, Second Language Acquisition, and Translation Studies.
